



Conflict of Interest Policy

In the role of utilising ATFA Floor Inspector Accreditation, the following conflict of interest provisions apply:

- An inspector cannot inspect his or her own work;
- An inspector cannot inspect work which has utilised products or materials supplied by their own company, unless to assess the situation purely for their own company or as free support to the client/contractor;
- An inspector cannot inspect work where the inspector has a disagreement or dispute with the client, contractor or supplier of material/product;
- An inspector cannot reinspect a job that he or she has already inspected for another party;
- An inspector cannot quote for other services on work which he/she has inspected or inspect on work he/she has previously quoted other services upon;
- An inspector must demonstrate honesty and integrity, openly declare and explain any relationships such as previous employment, previous contracting or sub-contracting, family connections, friendships, association memberships, work involvement with one of the parties or any other matter which could be perceived as a conflict of interest; and
- Where an inspector considers that past relationships with a party involved in the inspection (commissioning party, product manufacturer, service provider and their contractors or owners) could be a perceived conflict of interest, then the inspector should decline the inspection.
